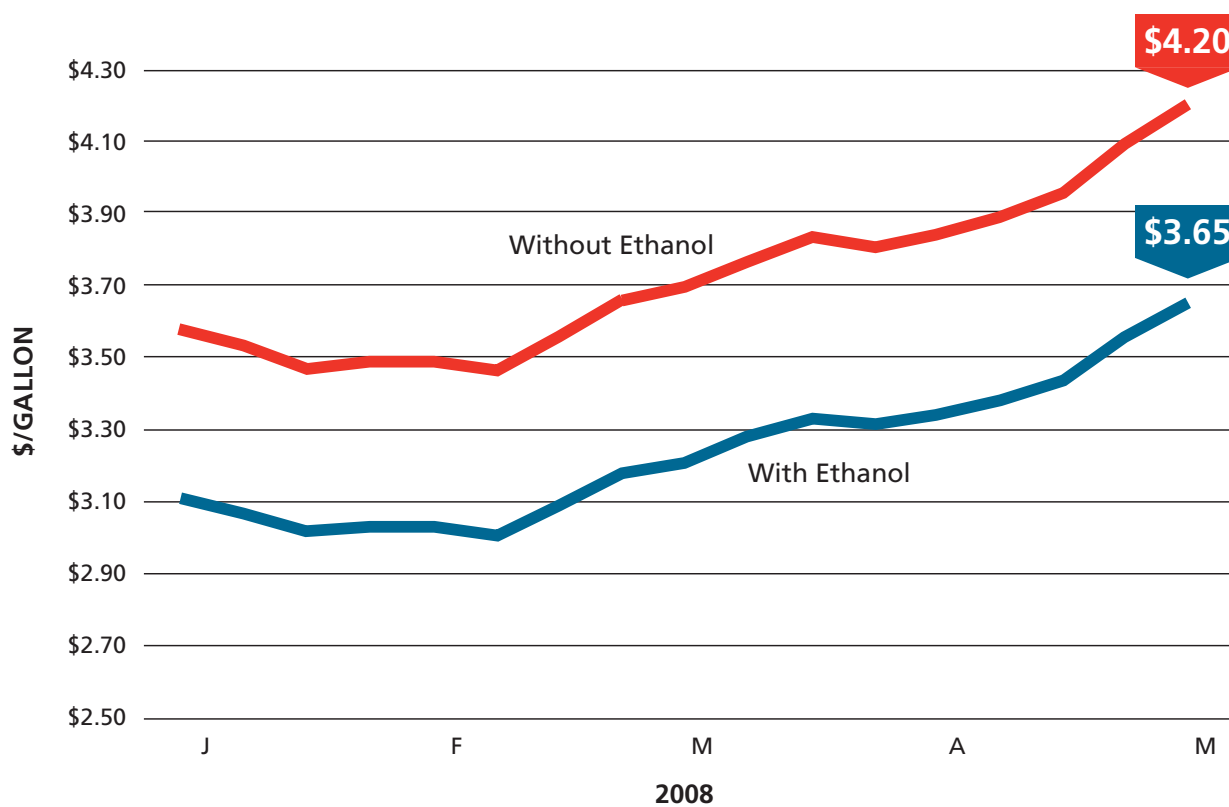


# WITHOUT ETHANOL WE'D BE PAYING OVER \$4.00 A GALLON FOR GASOLINE TODAY
